Initially focusing on Nevada County, particularly Grass Valley and Nevada City, the project aims to expand its impact to other areas within the Sacramento California Jobs First region. Catalyst funding will support capacity building, research, and foundation building for sustainability.

Sierra Commons' project prioritizes diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) by providing resources, scholarships, and targeted support to individuals historically underrepresented in entrepreneurship. By lowering barriers to entry and fostering an inclusive entrepreneurial landscape, the project aims to create economic opportunities for all community members. Furthermore, partnerships with local organizations and agencies ensure that the project addresses the specific needs of disinvested communities, promoting equity and resilience.
